

CARPET BEETLE TREATMENT PREPARATION FORM

RESIDENTS, PLEASE READ INSTRUCTIONS WHEN SIGNING CARPET BEETLE PREPARATION FORM

Q: What must you do before your home is treated for carpet beetles?

- 1. Clear: ALL floors, even closet floors must be cleared of all objects to give your technician access to all floor surfaces.
- 2. Vacuum and clean: ALL rugs, carpets and furniture especially between and under cushions. Mop all tile and vinyl floors. Sweep all wood and concrete floors.
- 3. Pull ALL furniture 2 feet away from walls.
- 4. Pets and people must vacate the unit for 3 hours. Fish bowls and aquariums may remain in home if air supply is turned off and tank is properly covered with plastic or non-permeable material.

Treating the Home:

Q: What will the technician do to treat for carpet beetles in your home?

A: A fine insecticide/growth regulator aerosol will be applied to all floor areas and potentially infested areas. These areas may include carpet, rugs, tile, furniture, and under furniture cushions.

Q: Will all carpet beetles die immediately after treatment?

A: No. Nearly all carpet beetles present will be killed by the time you return home. However, don't be alarmed if you see some carpet beetles 3-4 weeks after treatment. These carpet beetles are typically newly hatched from their protective pupal case and will be killed by the residual effects of the insecticide.

Q: How soon can you vacuum following treatments?

ollowing treatment for 3-4 weeks.
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A: Normal vacuuming can be resumed 24 hours after your home has been treated and should continue every 3-4 days

CARPET BEETLE PREPARATION FORM – RESIDENT MUST READ AND SIGN

- 1. Resident and pet must be prepared to vacate the apartment for 3 hours after treatment.
- 2. Resident must clear all articles from the floor area (including closets).
- 3. Resident must vacuum all carpet and tile areas thoroughly before and after treatment. This is very important!
