



BED BUG TREATMENT PREPARATION FORM

Please make a copy for the resident and leave the signed form in the EnviroSMART book

The following steps are required and will assist in the elimination of your bed bug population. Please make required preparations the day prior to your scheduled service day. All steps must be completed for treatment to be performed.

Please prepare ALL rooms. Your entire apartment must be treated.

1. ___ Remove linens from beds and wash and dry them using the hottest temperature that is safe for your items and place in sealed bags.
2. ___ Discard torn or heavily infested mattresses and box springs, and dismantle bed frames. Remove mesh covering from under box spring and any infested furniture.
3. ___ Remove draperies and wash and dry them using the hottest temperature that is safe and place in sealed bags.
4. ___ Empty dresser drawers and nightstands in ALL bedrooms. Wash & dry or dry clean all clothing and fabrics, using the hottest temperature that is safe for your items, and place in sealed bags.
5. ___ Remove items from flooring, especially where the carpet meets the baseboards, including closets. Clean up excess clutter. Pull ALL furniture 2 feet away from walls.
6. ___ Cover or remove items on kitchen and bathroom countertops. Food preparation surfaces should be cleaned after service is completed.
7. ___ Vacuum floors thoroughly, especially where the carpet meets the baseboards. Vacuum upholstered furniture, paying attention to seams and skirting. Place vacuum bag in an exterior trash receptacle.
8. ___ Remove carpet from tack strip in infested rooms.
9. ___ Fish tanks and aquariums must be shut off and covered with plastic.
10. ___ People and pets must vacate unit for **4** hours.

FAQ:

Q: What will the technician do to treat for bed bugs in your home?

A: A fine mist insecticide/growth regulator will be applied to all baseboards, corners, ceiling joints, around windows, outlets, bed frames, box spring and mattress sides. A separate fine mist insecticide/growth regulator aerosol will be applied to all carpeted areas. A non-residual insecticide fog will then be applied to the unit.

Q: Will all bed bugs die immediately after treatment?

A: No. Nearly all bed bugs will be killed by the time you return home. However, don't be alarmed if you see some bed bugs 3-4 weeks after treatment. These bed bugs are typically newly hatched and will be killed by the residual effects of the treatment.

Q: Is a follow up treatment or inspection necessary?

A: No. Don't be alarmed if you see some bed bugs 3-4 weeks after treatment. These bed bugs are typically newly hatched and will be killed by the residual effects of the treatment. If you are seeing live bed bugs after 30 days please notify the office and a follow up treatment will be scheduled.
